<b>Who was targeted?</b>	All year groups/ More able children
<b>Outline of project:</b>	
<p>The school have taken up the KTC programme. As part of the programme, we as a school, have adopted the Shared and Guided Reading. All staff have been on the shared and guided reading training led by the KTC.</p> <p>As part of Guided reading I have used the WiT budget to invest in books both Fiction and Non-fiction books. These books have been bought to plan guided reading sessions for children. Alongside the PM books I came across the PM guided reading comprehension cards for teachers to use in guided reading as well as using it as part of a guided reading independent activity.</p> <p>The guided reading comprehension cards can be used in both shared and guided reading. There is a CD in each box that contains different text types that can be used during shared reading.</p> <p>Reciprocal Reading books have been bought into school to use an independent activity for the more able groups. Children have been trained on the process of carrying it out. It can also be used by the TA as a group activity.</p>

<p>PM Benchmark books – Fiction books ranging from Level 1 – 30 ; Year 2015-16 WiT budget            PM Benchmark books – Non-Fiction books ranging from Level 1 – 30; Year 2016-17 WiT budget            PM Guided Reading Comprehension cards; Year 2016-17 WiT budget            Reciprocal Reading Books; Year 2016-17 WiT budget            These books/resources have been bought in before the autumn term and put in place ready to start the new year.</p>	
<b>Impact</b>	
<p>All staff have found the books are pitched appropriately for the guided reading groups. They make it easier to plan from. There a variety of fiction and non-fiction books giving staff and children a range to look at. Children are given books appropriate to the level of reading and understanding. Well-resourced making it easier for staff to access. The books support the assessment we do for each child using the PM benchmark kit across the school.</p> <p>It has had an impact to the PM benchmark levels across the school. Most children have moved up in their levels and are moving towards the expected level for their year group. It also helps target children who haven't met their expected reading level. The children want to read and enjoy reading the range of books provided. We have seen that more children enjoy reading across the school and want to read.</p>	
<b>Lessons learnt – advice for other schools</b>	
<p>The guided reading comprehension cards do not have answers to go with them.            Children need to be trained before using the Reciprocal Reading books independently. Lower ability children will need to use them with an adult.            Time will be needed for Reading Champions to set up the resources.            Ensure the planning is kept alongside the books so that you can start to create a bank of resources for all staff to use.            Ensure staff are given time to look at the resources and see how they can be used effectively.
