

FIVE WAYS TO MAKE A FRIEND by GILLIAN CROSS



Thinking the man is really the notorious thief who is stealing famous statues across London, he steps up his campaign against him — only to discover that the homeless community have their own code. Can Hector be a hero? Can he unmask the thief? And can he do the bravest thing of all — learn how not to be a bully? This story will grip you from start to finish with its mystery, as you follow Hector's journey from zero to hero. Read beginning for a taste of Hector's antics.



Some ideas for activities and book chat:

- The story explores the theme of bullying and on the surface Hector is not a very nice person at all. Discuss why you think he behaves as he does and what has led him to be this way? How do you think he changes?
- There are several strong characters in the story. Which do you find the most interesting and why?
- Homelessness runs throughout the story. Thomas is treated quite badly by many people. Place yourself in a homeless person's shoes, how do you think it might feel? What would be your biggest worries or concerns?
- Think of a time you have been really kind to someone. Jot down, who? Why? And something about what you did or said that was a kind? Share this with a talk partner.

Fran's father works as Head Gardener at Longbarrow House, and Fran is poking about in the garden one day when she uncovers a bone and accidentally breaks it. Then Leo, one of the children that lives in the House, breaks his leg. More strange coincidences happen – is the garden causing them, or predicting them? And are there such things as ghosts? A spooky tale that will chill you, but also a poignant read set during the eve of the First World War about friendship.



Some ideas for activities and book chat:

- The theme of coincidences runs through the story. Explain the meaning of the word.
- Fran thinks the coincidences are trying to tell her something or give her a message or warning. Do you believe this sort of thing happens in real life?
- Fran is a helpful character even though at first, she feels that she has been roped in to look after Leo and doesn't really want to. What do you think about her character?
- The story is spooky or eerie in places, which is your favourite spooky part and why?
- The story is set just before the First World War. Write down 5 facts you think you know about this period of history. Check them with a partner or the rest of the class.
- Jessie and Evan are mischievous younger siblings to Leo. Do you have a younger or older sibling? Are they fun to be around or do they get up to mischief too? Talk to a partner about them and come up with 5 words to describe them.
